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ABSTRACT

The purpose of this research was to analyze the students' speaking ability at the first year at English Department of Bung Hatta University. Specifically, it aimed at describing the students' speaking ability. The design of this research was descriptive research. The population of the research was the first year students at English Department of Bung Hatta University. In selecting the sample, the researcher used total sampling technique. The number of sample was 32 students.

The result of this research revealed that in general the first year students' speaking ability at English Department of Bung Hatta University were classified into having good ability. It was proved that (10%) students had very good ability, (66%) students had good ability, (24%) students had moderate ability, (0%) students had low ability. The students' speaking ability in categories of content was moderate. It was proved that (41%) students had moderate ability. The students' speaking ability in categories of grammar was low. It was proved that (72%) students had low ability. The students' speaking ability in categories of vocabulary was very good. It was proved that (52%) students had very good ability. The students' speaking ability in categories of pronuciaton was good. It was proved that (76%) students had good ability. The students' speaking ability in categories of fluency was good. It was proved that (84%) students had good ability

Based on the result, lecturer are suggested to improve students' ability into very good by giving some more practice in speaking and give exercise in grammar because the students' ability in grammar is low. For students, they should do more practice in speaking to improve their speaking ability, especially in grammar.

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CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

This chapter discusses about background of the problem, identification of problem, limitation of problem, formulation of the problem, research questions, purpose of the study, significance of the study and definition of the key terms.

1.1. Background of the Problem

In this era, English becomes an important language in the world. It is used as the mean of communication among nations in the world and many mass media, printed or electronic, and some scientific books are written in English. The existence of English makes it the most recommended language to be learnt in every country.

In learning process, there are two skills that will be learnt by the English learners; receptive skills and productive skills. The receptive skills are listening and reading. These skills are also known as passive skills. The learners do not need to produce language, they just have to receive and understand it. The productive skills are speaking and writing. These skills are also known as active skills because the learners need to produce the language. In studying English, students should master these four skills, listening, speaking, reading and writing. Besides, they also should master grammar, good pronunciation, and vocabulary.

Speaking is skill that someone should master beside other skills. Speaking is important because by mastering the speaking skill, someone can communicate

with others. They can interact with others and can deliver some information that they have.

Because of the importance of speaking, speaking skill is learnt by learner at Bung Hatta University, especially at English Department, the first year students have special program called Intensive Course in which the focus is speaking in order that, the students can improve their speaking. Most of the time in learning session is used to practice speaking. In fact, there are some students, based on informal interview on August 29th 2016 who still have trouble to speak English. This because the students still had lack of vocabulary and they had difficulties in making correct sentences when they speak, eventhough they have already been trained intensively for one semester called intensive course.

Based on the description above, the researcher is interested in conducting the research on analysis of the first year students' speaking ability at English Department of BungHatta University.

1.2 Identification of the Problem

To have good speaking skill, it can be supported by knowledge of language components. They are vocabulary, pronunciation and grammar.

In assessing speaking ability, there are many components that can be a reference. Brown (2010:212) divides categories of assessing speaking into five categories. They are grammar, vocabulary, fluency, and pronunciation. These components can refer to measure student's speaking ability.

The first component is grammar which is related to what tenses used by students. The second is vocabulary which is related to the words that students choose in speaking. The third is content which is related to how the students

express their understanding about the topic in speaking. The last is fluency which is related to the student's ability to speak English.

Brown (2010: 184-185) divides basic types of speaking into five stages. They are imitative, intensive, responsive, interactive, and extensive. In this research, the researcher uses extensive speaking. Extensive (monologue) oral production task include speeches, oral expression, and story telling. One type of oral production task that is used in this research is oral expression.

1.3 The limitation of the Problem

Based on the identification above, the researcher limited the research, and just focused to describe the students' Speaking Ability at English Department of Bung Hatta University by considering the five components of speaking: grammar, vocabulary, content, fluency, and pronunciation.

1.4 Formulation of the problem

The researcher formulated problem as: "How is the first year students' speaking ability at English Department of Bung Hatta University?".

1.5 Research Questions

Relating to the formulation of the problem above, the research questions are formulated as follows:

- How is the ability of the first year students to express idea/content in speaking?
- 2. How is the ability of the first year students fluency in speaking?
- 3. How is the ability of the first year students pronunciation in speaking?

- 4. How is the ability of the first year students in using grammar in speaking?
- 5. How is the ability of the first year students in using appropriate vocabulary in speaking ?

1.6 Purposes of the Research

The main purpose of the research is to analyze the students' speaking ability at the first year of English Department at Bung Hatta University Padang.

The specific purposes are:

- 1. To describe the first year students' speaking ability in expressing content in speaking
- 2. To describe the first year students' fluency in speaking.
- 3. To describe the first year students' ability in pronuncing words in speaking.
- 4. To describe the first year students' grammar ability in speaking.
- 5. To describe the first year students' ability in using appropriate vocabulary in speaking.

1.7 Significance of the Research

The result of this research are expected to give contributions and benefit for the lecturers, the students, and further researcher. For the lecturers, they can get information about the first grade students' speaking ability, so the lecturers can improve their speaking ability. For the students who have low ability can improve their speaking ability. For further researcher, it can be as a reference in conducting a similar study for next time.

1.8 Definition of the Key Terms

The terms related to this study are:

- 1. Analysis is the study of something by examining its parts and breaking a complex topic or substance into smaller parts to gain a better understanding of it, it is to investigate the student's ability in speaking.
- 2. Ability is the students' competence in speaking.
- 3. Speaking is an active productive skill and makes use of oral production.
- 4. Grammar is the rules for forming words to construct sentence in speaking
- 5. Pronunciation is the way of word spoken.
- 6. Vocabulary is an appropriate diction which is used in communication.
- 7. Content is the description or explanation realated to the topic
- 8. Fluency is the ability to speak easily and smoothy: especially to speak a foreign language easily and effectively
