

CHAPTER 5

CONCLUSION

This chapter contains conclusions and suggestions. The writer draws some findings concerning Erotomania, also known as De Clerembault's condition. The study questions' findings lead to a conclusion. The suggestions, on the other hand, are designed to assist the next researcher who intends to investigate the same issue in doing the research more efficiently.

5.1 Conclusion

Based on the findings and discussion in the previous chapter, the writer found that the main character in the film *The Eye of the Stalker* has psychological problems. The psychological problem is Erotomania or De Clerembault syndrome. The writer analyzed the problem from the dialogue, gestures, and expressions of the players. The writer found a total of 21 data in this study, 15 data on erotomania symptoms, and 6 data on the impact of erotomania.

In the case of Erotomania in this film, from the 4 symptoms of Erotomania, the writer found only three types of symptoms. For these three types of Erotomania symptoms, there are 15 data found. 8 data on stalking, 5 harassing behaviors, and 2 data on lying. It can be concluded that the most Primes symptom he does is stalking. Primes always follows Beth wherever she goes. The reason Primes does this is that people with Erotomania will feel that the victim must be under his supervision so that everything done by the victim cannot be separated from the monitoring of the

sufferer. Primes also feels that his relationship with Beth is special so he treats Beth like a lover, where Beth feels uncomfortable or safe near the primes.

From these data, it can also be concluded that crimes committed by Primes can be sorted from mild to those beyond reasonable limits, which includes misdemeanors of stalking and lying. Harassing behavior is a serious crime because it can threaten the life of the victim, as well as what Primes does in this film, he behaves out of bounds to threaten the lives of those around him.

For the impact of erotomania, there are 3 impact classifications with 6 data such as 2 impact data on Primes, 2 impact data on Beth as victims, and 2 impact data on people around (Beth's mother and Liz). From the data found, it can be concluded that the impact of Erotomania not only affects the sufferer but also affects the victim and people around the sufferer. The impact experienced by sufferers and those caused by sufferers on their surroundings can be very dangerous or only have a small impact. The impact experienced by Primes or its consequences is included in the dangerous category because it is always threatening to behave that can take someone's life, it occurs due to the mental state of Primes who suffer from Erotomania.
