# **CHAPTER I**

## 1.1 Background of The Research

Despite its exclusion from official English dictionaries, slang is widely used in informal conversations, originally associated with youth but now used by adults and the elderly alike.

According to Coleman (2004: 2), slang words often pertain to a specific age group or adhere to a particular trend, defining group identity through short-lived expressions. These words emerge from a societal need for novel, creative, humorous terms, enabling individuals to express themselves uniquely, provocatively, and amicably. Furthermore, slang words are pervasive and can manifest as new meanings for existing words, entirely new words, or

abbreviations. Another source defines slang as an informal, nonstandard vocabulary composed of coinages, arbitrarily changed words, and extravagant or facetious figures of speech. This vocabulary reflects the attitudes and identities of social groups and often becomes a marker of group identity through the use of short-lived expressions (Clausius Press, 2023). Mattiello (2008) highlights that slang words follow a distinct word-formation system known as morphology. This system involves various methods, such as affixation, conversion, compounding, clipping, reduplication, abbreviation, and variation, to create new words with unique meanings.

According to Partridge (2015), slang primarily prioritizes practicality over strict adherence to scientific laws, grammar rules, or philosophical ideas. It functions as a coded language exclusive to certain groups, intentionally designed to be somewhat enigmatic to outsiders. The main goal of slang is to enhance the user's sense of friendship and excitement. Niceforo (as cited in Partridge, 2015) proposed that slang serves various purposes. It entertains spirited youth, allowing them to distinguish themselves, avoid clichés, and introduce fresh elements into their speech. Furthermore, slang abbreviates words, adds sophistication to language, navigates challenging situations with humour, enriches linguistic diversity, and signals group affiliation, whether within a specific school, profession, or social class.

With the advancement of technology, slang word has become prevalent across various media platforms, including social media channels like chat messages, Instagram, Twitter, YouTube, and TikTok, as well as in literary works such as novels, songs, and films. This research aims to scrutinize and analyze the use of slang words in the Netflix Series *Never Have I Ever Season 1*.

Never Have I Ever is a coming-of-age comedy-drama television series created by Mindy Kaling and Lang Fisher. It premiered on Netflix in April 2020 and quickly gained popularity for its witty humour, diverse representation, and relatable storytelling. The show

centers on the life of teenage Indian-American Devi Vishwakumar, who resides in Southern California. Devi, played by rookie Maitreyi Ramakrishnan, is adjusting to her father's recent passing while juggling the demands of high school. With the support of her friends and family, Devi sets out on a voyage of self-discovery to elevate her social standing and find a partner. Ramakrishnan delivers standout performances as Devi, Poorna Jagannathan as Devi's mother Nalini, and Richa Moorjani as Devi's cousin Kamala. The series also has a varied ensemble cast, including Darren Barnet, Jaren Lewison, Lee Rodriguez, and Ramona Young.

One of the most notable aspects of *Never Have I Ever* is its realistic portrayal of the immigrant experience and the complications of combining cultural identification with the desire for acceptance. - "Dope": Fabiola might use this term to describe something she thinks is excellent or impressive.

#### 3. Kamala:

- "Flex": Kamala might use this term if she wants to boast about an achievement or something she's proud of.
