In non-literal meaning, there's this kind of element as figurative language. According to Kennedy Figurative language is divided into seven types, they are Metaphore,

Simile, Personification, Hyperbole, Allusion, Metonymy, and Symbol. Researcher focuses on finding hyperbole, the forms of hyperbole expressions, and the intended meanings of the hyperbolic in *Anne With An E* movie. The types of hyperbole are limited by using the theory of Claudia Claridge (2011). Claudia categorized hyperbole into seven different forms: (1) Single-word, (2) Phrasal, (3) Clausal, (4) Numerical, (5)The role of the superlative, (6) Comparison, and (7) Repetition.

The important point of this research is for readers to know about hyperbole and to increase the knowledge of the writer and readers and hope that this research can be a reference for other researchers to study hyperbole.
