The basic emotions are divided into six categories by Parrot (2001): love, joy, surprise, anger, sadness, and fear. Emotion itself is a facial expression that can be used to deduce emotion. People will express their emotions in a variety of ways, including positive and negative emotions. Emotion is split into two categories, according to Staats (1975). The first is a cheerful, joyful, in love, delighted, or pleased emotional state. Furthermore, a bad emotional state can be described as furious, disturbed, hateful, afraid, or unpleasant. Because emotion expression is a speech act in which the listener acknowledges the speaker's intention to execute that act, it is regarded to be one of the illocutionary acts (Rintell, 1984). Especially with the help of today's social media, which allows people to express themselves more easily.
